The Detroit Association of Black Organizations (D.A.B.O.) presented the world renowned comedian and social activist Dick Gregory at the organizations House of Delegates meeting and Summit of Black Organizations. On Saturday, February 26, 2011 Dick Gregory was the featured guest on Rev. Sheffield's "On the Line" live radio broadcast on WGPR 107.5 and then attended a Summit & House of Delegates Meeting which Gregory was the keynote speaker. The summit was be hosted at the Detroit Cares Alternative High School located at 8100 W. Davison and the Jefferies Freeway (I-96) in Detroit, MI and was free and open to the public.

Dick Gregory lead the conversation on overcoming differences through combined efforts and raising the bar within the Black community with DABO delegates. The purpose of this summit was not a meeting to discuss philosophical, religious, or political differences as this has been done for decades. Dick Gregory and DABO delegates will hold court on how to move Detroit forward and identify specific goals.
